FORM FOR AICE

The Advanced International Certificate of Education (AICE) is an international pre-university curriculum and examination system, administered by the Cambridge International Examinations (CIE). AICE is a group certificate, awarded on the basis of a broad and balanced curriculum. Under the new AICE scheme, courses can be taken at the Advanced (A) or Advanced Subsidiary (AS) Levels. Courses taken at the A level contribute 2 credits and those taken at the AS Levels contribute 1 credit to the AICE group award. To receive the AICE diploma, a student must have a total of 6 credits with at least one subject from each subject group.

First Year:

Each student will take FIVE AS levels including English.
In May/June 2011 he/she will take FOUR AS Level Examinations in the chosen subjects.
English (AS Level) will begin in 2010, but will be taught over 2 years. Alternatively, a student may opt for Literature in English.
Environmental Management is taught only at the AS Level.
Sociology will be taught over 2 years at the A Level only.

Second Year:

Each student will take a minimum of THREE and a maximum of FOUR A Levels and AS English. (University admissions require THREE A Levels.)
In May/June 2012 he/she will take:
a) Three or Four A Levels
b) English AS Level
c) Any AS Levels he/she wants to improve upon.

FORM FOR ISC

The Indian School Certificate Examination is an examination after a two year course of studies beyond the ICSE (Std. 10) or its equivalent through the medium of English. The ISC curriculum offers a wide variety of subject choices and is recognised worldwide. Not all combinations are however viable in meeting the requirement of professional and career goals leading to University courses or careers and subject choices must be made with due deliberation. Students become eligible for the ISC certificate awarded by the council, if they meet the standard in five or more subjects, which include English and Environmental Education at one and the same examination.
