Aditi creates opportunities for students to become confident, thinking, independent individuals who are sensitive to diversity, aware of their heritage and able to face the challenges of their time.

#### Aditi's Philosophy

Aditi is a private, secular school, which provides an education which

- is informed by the best current practices through continuous professional development
- is broad-based, encompassing a range of inter-connected disciplines including the humanities, the creative and performing arts, science and technology
- is committed to academic excellence
- will produce individuals who can contribute meaningfully to the world

#### **Expectations from parents of High School and Pre-University Sections**

Being a parent of a teenager is perhaps the most complex of tasks that adults have to undertake. At Aditi we expect parents to be *hands-on*. This means setting clear boundaries for your child, being present for parent-teacher conferences, ensuring that your child does not miss classes, community service programmes or outward bound trips *for* family functions, extended family holidays, weddings or concerts. Proactive, positive parenting which is supportive of the school's philosophy is expected from Aditi parents. Students in High School and Pre-University Sections are still minors and are not always capable of making rational decisions. They are not adult income earners. Hence, parents need to ensure that all teenage events are properly supervised. The school has open discussions regarding various issues facing today's teenagers and has regularly mailed parents regarding safety concerns at parties and concerts. Careful reading of all communication and advisories from the school, acting on them and sharing the same with students is also expected.

#### **Balanced Parenting**

"Parental involvement has a long and rich history of being studied. Decades of studies, many of them by Diana Baumrind, a clinical and developmental psychologist at the University of California, Berkeley, have found that 'the optimal parent is one who is involved and responsive, who sets high expectations but respects her child's autonomy. These "authoritative parents" appear to hit the sweet spot of parental involvement and generally raise children who do better academically, psychologically and socially than children whose parents are either permissive or less involved, or controlling and more involved. Parents also have to be clear about their own values. Children watch us closely". (Madeline Levine)

#### **Sports**

The school will support sporting ambitions, if clear communication about sporting schedules is regularly received from parents. Students need to stay committed to sporting fitness, academic achievement and other activities the school has to offer. It may not always be possible to alter examination schedules. Attendance at other times needs to be impeccable. **Students with sporting ambitions who are not also committed to academic excellence should not apply.** 

#### **Expectations from students**

Aditi offers a wide range of options in academic and co-curricular activities. Students are expected to show commitment to their basket of choices. Aditi is unequivocally committed to academic excellence. This is a school where all students including "nerds" are celebrated. We want students who are excited about learning and scholarship, who delight in books, ideas and the world around them. Those who do not consider academics important and who are unwilling to put in the concerted effort are requested not to apply here. We expect our students to be mindful of the fact that their parents are giving them this educational opportunity, leading to a culture of respect and appreciation and disavowal of any sense of entitlement. This includes not condoning behavior like indifference, ungratefulness, constantly asking for accommodations to be made and asking for recommendations and transcripts without due notice. We do not appreciate hubris in any form, not just in students but in all members of the community.

Aditi teachers expect students to be passionately and deeply engaged with the learning process. This means active participation in class, since teachers will use diverse teaching methods. Students need to make the most of the varied learning opportunities that are offered. They need to build academic stamina through regular study and being actively involved in academic enhancing programmes like professional forums. Student-led initiatives are encouraged.

Students who do not intend to fully avail of all the academic and other opportunities that the school has to offer will not thrive here.

## **Processes and Procedures in Pre-University**

#### **Daily Routine for Students in School**

- 1. Arrive to school on time for homeroom session which begins at 7:45 a.m.
- 2. Students who come for morning practice must ensure that they are in class on time for the homeroom session with the class teacher (CT).
- 3. Maintain classroom orderliness by placing bags on shelves, keeping the floor and desks clean, and ensuring that furniture is arranged properly.
- 4. Use the class common stationery judiciously with the permission of the class representative and place the same back in the locker after use.
- 5. Participate in singing the national anthem and reading the preamble.
- 6. Acknowledge that retests will be conducted only if the student misses the test for a curricular or co-curricular activity in which they represent the school, state or the country.
- 7. Be punctual in attending regular classes, especially the ones that may not be in your regular classroom. This applies to CT time as well.
- 8. Eat snacks and lunch inside the classroom only. 'Junk Food' and aerated drinks (including energy drinks) are not allowed in school.
- 9. Exhibit respect and kindness towards **everyone** in the school.
- 10. Not use any food delivery services like Swiggy, Zomato, etc. while in school.
- 11. Avoid taking leave for frivolous reasons. (A leave note should be sent by parents to the respective class teacher preferably before or on the day of absence).
- 12. Be present in school on the last day before and the first day after, a holiday.
- 13. Strict adherence to school's Child Protection and Anti Bullying policies at all times.

#### **Dress Code**

Parents should ensure that the following rules and regulations regarding school uniform are strictly adhered to:

- 1. School Uniform Aditi T-Shirt (Blue/Maroon), prescribed beige trousers, regular school jacket (non-school jackets are not allowed), prescribed black shoes with socks.
- 2. PE uniform to be worn when on the field. (Aditi PE T-Shirt and shorts/track pants only).
- 3. Students are not allowed to wear PE uniform for regular classes in the classroom or while boarding the school bus or own transportation, in the morning or after school. They need to change into their normal school uniform after the PE block.
- 4. No jewellery or makeup. (Only small ear studs are allowed, for boys and girls).
- 5. No nail colour or nail extensions.
- 6. Long hair for girls should be tied at all times.
- 7. Boys should maintain neat grooming standards with regular haircuts and remain clean-shaven.
- 8. Colouring or streaking of hair is not allowed.

#### **Transport**

- 1. Be punctual in joining the bus line/OTA line, post school. (OTA = Own Transport Arrangement)
- 2. Students are not to hang around in the school after they have collected the OTA token.
- 3. Uphold the expected decorum on the school bus.
- 4. Submit letters or send emails for any changes in bus routes, early departures, etc.
- 5. All school rules on the use of electronic devices apply on the school bus too.
- 6. Students have to be in full regular school uniform to board the school bus and own transportation (morning and evening). PE uniform is not allowed.

#### **Electronic Devices**

- 1. Students have to hand in all electronic devices (Phones/headphones/earphones/smart watches, etc.) to their class teacher during home room time in the morning. It will be returned to them during the home room time at the end of the day.
- 2. Electronic devices (Laptop/iPad) are permitted in classroom subject to supervision/approval of the teacher present in class.

#### Socially Useful and Productive Work (SUPW) and Other Outbound Trips

- 1. Socially Useful and Productive Work (SUPW) is a compulsory component of the MAIS curriculum and plays a significant role in the college application process. The programme not only promotes community engagement but also helps students develop compassion, empathy, and essential practical skills.
- 2. SUPW is a mandatory and integral part of our school's academic and co-curricular framework and the grade of this will be part of the transcript.
- 3. For SUPW activities and all other school trips, the school's code of conduct, anti-bullying policy, and all disciplinary guidelines apply without exception—during travel, at the venue, in accommodation, and at all times while students are under school supervision.

- 4. Students are expected to follow staff instructions promptly, show respect to all teachers and service providers, remain with the group at all times, be punctual, and represent the school responsibly and positively in public spaces.
- 5. Parents and students share equal responsibility for ensuring appropriate conduct and adherence to school rules.
- 6. Serious or repeated breaches of school rules may result in consequences, including but not limited to suspension, documentation in the student's permanent record, or, in extreme cases, expulsion from school.

#### **Communication with Parents**

- 1. Parents should check emails regularly and respond whenever required.
- 2. Ensure that the email ID and phone numbers (of both parents/guardian) provided to the school is correct and updated in case of a change.
- 3. Email is the preferred medium for communication and the Class Teacher is the first point of contact for any academic or non-academic matters.
- 4. Whatsapp messaging is not allowed.
- 5. Contact the school front desk in case of a genuine emergency and they will connect you to the relevant person.
- 6. Unless it is an emergency, avoid emailing during later hours. Provide CTs ample time to revert to your email, especially over the weekends.
- 7. Parents are required to make a note of significant days (like PTC, examination dates, SUPW, Internship week, holidays, vacations, etc.) as mentioned in the school calendar.
- 8. Submit leave letters (hard copy or email) in the morning of the day of absence, in the event your child/ward is absent from school. A medical certificate needs to be attached if the student misses more than three days of school due to ill health. Taking leave for any other reason during the school term is highly discouraged.

#### A Guide to Active Parenting and Safety

- 1. Parenting a teenager demands active involvement. Please set clear boundaries, attend parent-teacher conferences, ensure regular attendance of your child/ward to school.
- 2. Advise them against bunking class/school.
- 3. Support community programs.
- 4. Please ensure that you supervise non-school teenage events, act on school advisories, and communicate the same with your child. Aditi regularly addresses teen issues and safety concerns at non-school events.
- 5. Set clear boundaries and expectations regarding issues like bullying, use of social media, responsible use of electronic devices, academic work, meeting deadlines and discipline.

#### **Disciplinary Action**

A student will face appropriate disciplinary action (as determined by the school) for the following. A record of the same will go into the student's permanent file.

- 1. Repeated non-compliance with any of the aforementioned processes and procedures.
- 2. Any conduct that disrupts or is likely to disrupt teaching or the institution's administration.
- 3. Intolerant or discriminatory behaviour, including racist, communal or sexist remarks, which reflect social or religious prejudice.
- 4. Use or attempted use of unauthorised or unfair means in tests and examinations or plagiarism in connection with assignments, projects and homework.

- 5. Late, incomplete and non-submission of assignments will lead to reduction of marks in the calculation of the term grade. Re-test is an option only if a student misses a test due to representation in any academic or co-curricular activity at the school, state or national or international level.
- 6. Not bringing the required materials to class (books, stationery, etc.) will impact the Effort Grade.
- 7. Deliberate, reckless or negligent conduct causing damage to property or persons. This includes improper use of furniture, school buildings and electrical appliances.
- 8. Rudeness or insolence towards any member of the teaching, administrative or support staff.
- 9. Failure to comply with any of the school's regulations, including those concerning the use of laboratories, electronics, transport, library and other facilities.
- 10. Evidence of the use of nicotine, tobacco, alcohol or drugs. Possession will be deemed as evidence of use. This also includes any form of vaping device or E-cigarettes.
- 11. Evidence of possession of any item that can be used as a weapon.
- 12. Bullying, ragging and other forms of humiliation (physical, emotional and/or digital).
- 13. Use of physical violence.
- 14. Use of inappropriate language.
- 15. Non-compliance with the uniform and dress code.
- 16. Repeated absenteeism and/or tardiness.
- 17. Indiscipline on the bus if your child/ward uses school transport.

The purpose of disciplinary measures is didactic not punitive; it is to guide children in decency and thoughtfulness. Appropriate and thoughtful conduct, like so many other competencies, is perfected through practice.

Application process will be completed by Saturday, February 28, 2026.

#### **IMPORTANT INFORMATION regarding the entrance test:**

Entrance test needs to be taken by all candidates on **Saturday**, **January 10**, **2026**.

The student will be tested on:

- English Language (creative writing) and Critical Thinking- all students need to take this component of the entrance test. (Duration -1 hour).
- **Mathematics** only students applying for Mathematics or Mathematics with Science need to take this component of the entrance test. (**Duration-30 minutes**).
- **Art** only students applying for Art. (**Duration 1 hour 30 minutes**).

Remember: There are no past papers available for reference and no syllabus that will be shared. The test will be at a Std.10 level across boards.

The test will be in person on school campus.

#### **SUBJECT SELECTION FOR AICE**

The Advanced International Certificate of Education (AICE) is an international pre-university curriculum and examination system, administered by the *Cambridge Assessment International Education* (CAIE). AICE is a group certificate, awarded on the basis of a broad and balanced curriculum. Under the new AICE scheme, courses can be taken at the Advanced (A) or Advanced Subsidiary (AS) Levels. Courses taken at the A level contribute 2 credits and those taken at the AS Levels contribute 1 credit to the AICE group award. To receive the AICE diploma, a student must have a total of 7 credits with at least one subject from each subject group, and AS Global Perspectives.

#### First Year:

In May / June 2027 he/she will take **FOUR / FIVE AS Level Examinations** in the chosen subjects.

#### **Second Year:**

In May / June 2028 he/she will take:

- a) Three or Four A Levels (University admissions require THREE A Levels.)
- b) AS English Language

#### SUBJECT SELECTION FOR ISC

The Indian School Certificate Examination (ISC) is an examination after a two year course of studies beyond the ICSE (Std. 10) or its equivalent through the medium of English. It is awarded by the *Council for the Indian School Certificate Examinations (CISCE)*, *New Delhi*. The ISC curriculum offers a wide variety of subject choices and is recognised worldwide. Not all combinations are viable to meet the specific requirements of courses/universities. **Subjects must be chosen with care.** Students become eligible for the ISC if they pass in **four** or more subjects, including English, at one and the same examination sitting.

- 1. Students who have done examinations other than the ICSE will be given only provisional entry until the *Council for the Indian School Certificate Examinations* grants them eligibility certificates to enroll for the ISC course.
- 2. Entry to Std. 11 is subject to confirmation only after the statement of results in the qualifying examination, conduct certificate and transfer certificate have been submitted.
- 3. We offer Indian Music Vocal (Hindustani) and Tabla. Students wishing to take Music must satisfy the Creative Arts Department that they have an aptitude for and a keen interest in Indian Classical music. It will be timetabled according to teacher availability.
- 4. All students wishing to do Art (AICE and ISC) will need to take an aptitude test in Art. In addition, those wishing to do AICE Art should have taken Art as a subject in the qualifying examination in Std. 10. Art students will have additional Art classes two Saturdays (morning) every month over the next two years.
- 5. Subjects will be offered only if a viable number of students apply.

Physical Education, Life Skills and Community Service are a compulsory part of the Pre-University Programme.







**Screen Shot of Cheque Entry** 





