01 Enquiry by Design

FACILITATOR

Geeta Paul brings over three decades of teaching expertise, having worked with both international and Indian curricula across Singapore and India. Her diverse teaching portfolio includes subjects such as Biology, Global Perspectives, Mathematics, Chemistry, and Textiles. She has

served as Head of Department, Science and for the past thirteen years, she has served as the Head of High School, demonstrating her leadership and commitment to education. She holds degrees in Science and Education from India and a Certificate in Educational Management from the University of Bath, U.K. She has played a pivotal role in conceptualising and initiating programs at Aditi. Move beyond 'covering content' to fostering deep understanding.

- Unpack standards to identify 'big ideas'

Through this workshop, you will explore how to unpack educational standards to identify the 'big ideas' – the key concepts and principles that are essential for deep learning. Participants will examine the nature of understanding, distinguishing it from knowledge, by focusing on the ability to apply, analyse, and create. We will also discuss effective assessment strategies that measure students' understanding and their capacity to transfer knowledge to new contexts. Finally, we will consider how to shift our teaching practices to actively engage students in making meaning and moving beyond the traditional approach of simply 'covering' content.

This will be a hands-on experience designed to equip us with practical strategies providing insights to further inform and recharge our teaching. It is in line within the National Curriculum Framework for School Education's curricular aims and goals, competencies and learning outcomes.
